Yuin Ghudjargah and TaikOz Quartet

The Dance and Drum concert is also being performed at 11am on Saturday 7 May, especially for a young audience. Ticket prices have been reduced for families and young people for what will be a visually and musically exciting concert.

Aboriginal dancers, *Yuin Ghudjargah*, will perform a program of song and dance. Cec McLeod, leader of this group, has been dancing for 20 years throughout Australia and overseas. The dancers include members of his family and men he has taught – all experienced traditional dancers.

Cec explained *Yuin Ghudjargah* means “children of the Yuin nation”. The Yuin Nation runs from south of Sutherland down to the border at Eden. “Ghudjargah” means children. He says Kangaroo Valley has always been “a huge ceremonial area where there has been a lot of dancing and singing, a lot of food eaten, and a lot of time shared with family”.

In the concert, Cec says, “We’re going to give you a big surprise! We’ll be doing the story of the Yuin, and it’ll be a story about the black duck, or Umbarra. Uncle Max will tell the story.”

The **TaikOz Quartet**, is a Sydney-based percussion group playing traditional Japanese Taiko drums.

Ian Cleworth explains that the art of Taiko drumming is more than just beating the drum. It incorporates a complete world of drumming, song and dance that on the one hand harks back to ancient Buddhist and Shinto rites and on the other, is a reflection of contemporary musical life, irrespective of one’s nationality.
